Minutes of the Meeting of Glusburn & Cross Hills Parish Council,
held on **THURSDAY 18th June 2009** at 7:00pm
in St Peters Church Hall, Crosshills.

6. To receive information on the following ongoing issues and decide further action where necessary.

6.1 Public Conveniences in Cross Hills:

The door into the disabled toilet has been damaged but has now been repaired by Marsden Contracting.

The electronic soap dispensers in both the ladies and gents toilets are now broken. Steven Marsden is to find out what firm made the dispensers.

6.2 Parish Council Vacancies

To be discussed at the end of the PC Meeting.

7. Highways & Transportation:

NYCC have made proposals to widen the footpath along Colne Road, Glusburn that enters Colne Road from Walker Close and runs towards Cross Hills. Near this area is a milestone that is in need of cleaning. The PC may consider cleaning the milestone.

8. Local Development Framework:

The new revised housing figures have now been agreed and released by CDC. Glusburn and Cross Hills are now down to 17% from 26%. Skipton is now at 40%.

PC requested that the Clerk writes to Jonathan Kerr at CDC and also copy the letter to the chief Executive at CDC. regarding the problems of filling local affordable housing with local people. The housing needs assessment survey needs to be looked at and updated.

9. Litter:

The environmental group along with Jason Perkins were very visible whilst they were patrolling the streets of Cross Hills last week, no fixed notices were given out in Cross Hills.

10. Appointment of Chairman of Committee's & Sub Committee's

a) Parks & Recreation:

Cllr Philip Baker was proposed by Cllr G Beck, this was seconded by Cllr P Barrett.

b) Finance:

Cllr G Beck was proposed by Cllr R Nicholson and seconded by Cllr Mrs M Nicholson.

c) Lighting: Cllrs were in agreement that a chairman of lighting was not required at the moment.

Appointment of Representatives :

a) Glusburn Institute:

Cllr A Thompson was proposed by Cllr G Beck, this was seconded by Cllr P Barrett.

b) YLCA (2 Representatives):

Cllr Mrs M Nicholson and Cllr P Baker were proposed by Cllr G Beck, these were seconded by Cllr P Barrett.

11. Reports:

11.1 Parks & Recreation / Amenity land, Colne Road,

Due to the park keeper not having a cash float to buy toilet rolls etc for the park toilets, the Clerk has arranged for Marsden Contractors to supply and deliver to the park keeper, as required toilet rolls and hand wash for the toilets in the park.

Cllr P Barrett asked if the PC would consider purchasing a display board for PC notices, to be placed at Glusburn Institute as the PC do not currently have a notice board in Glusburn. Clerk to obtain quotes.

11.2 Lighting and Christmas Lights:

The Christmas lights are now all ordered and also the work required to put them up before Christmas and take them down after has been ordered.

11.3 Allotments :

The PC contractor that will correct the work on the fence carried out by CDC contractors is due to start work shortly at the allotment site.

11.4 YLCA: Nothing to report.

11.5 CDC: At the recent meeting held by CDC regarding the proposed car parking charges in Cross Hills, a letter from Cross Hills Group Practice objecting to the car parking charges was not read out at the meeting. The PC would like to know why this letter was not read out during the meeting. Clerk to contact Chief Executive at CDC and ask why.

Cllrs R Nicholson, P Barrett attended the meeting at CDC regarding the car parking charges, it was debated for around 30 minutes by the policy committee and then voted on. The voting was 7 against and 6 for, which is how the proposal was voted out. There were not representatives for the car parking charges at Embsay and Gargrave and these sites will now have charges applied to the,. Cross Hills is the only site without car parking charges.

The meeting on the 24th June 09 will be looking at the proposals regarding 2 weekly refuse collection.
