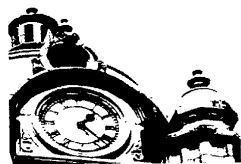
ALLOTMENTS

DOG FOULING

The Parish Council is trying to persuade the District Council to change its low profile enforcement and to aim towards the total elimination of dog fouling in the District.
